



Panzer Ends Perfect Year

John Marshall Conquest Is
40th Straight for
Panthers

Coach Al Gorton congratulated his players as they closed the first undefeated basketball season for Panzer College last night with a 58-38 victory over John Marshall College of Jersey City. It was the 40th straight triumph for the East Orange cagers, who won their season's finale on their home court.

Long Island University's Blackbirds were the last to conquer the Panthers, beating Panzer by five points in their scheduled game last year.

Herman Knuppel, lanky center, paced the Panther quintet with 25 points, as Swede Masin and Jerry Kampf, his teammates, also scored in double figures.

The campaign is ended, according to Gorton, who indicated Panzer will not enter any post-season tournament or play an exhibition game of any kind.
